Dr. Durryle Brooks' talk will explore the idea of love as a radical and necessary function in our movement building and social justice work. Drawing on Dr. King's notion of a "love that does justice," Dr. Brooks' work articulates an operational vision of love that is based on our collective healing and one that prioritizes our overall well-being.

Durryle Brooks, Ph.D. is an interdisciplinary researcher and a scholar-practitioner from Baltimore, MD. He has a B.A. from St. Mary's College of Maryland in Religious Studies, an M.A. in Sexuality Studies from SF State University, and a Ph.D. in Teacher Education and School Improvement from the University of Massachusetts-Amherst with a concentration in Social Justice Education. He is the Founder and CEO of Love and Justice Consulting LLC, an organization that provides leaders with diversity and social justice learning opportunities to increase their capacity to effectively and authentically engage difference.
